

Assistant Professor of Medical Rhetoric or Medical Humanities (Tenure Track, F0257A1)

The Department of English at Old Dominion University invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor of Medical Humanities or Medical Rhetoric. This 10-month appointment begins July 2024. We are open to applicants from a wide array of approaches and backgrounds related to medical humanities or medical rhetoric, including but not limited to health justice; narrative medicine; discourses of public health; rhetoric; disability studies; racial justice; and/or feminist, queer, and trans health.

This position affords researchers the unique opportunity to engage at the intersection of an upcoming institutional merger between Old Dominion University and Eastern Virginia Medical School as well as larger regional efforts to focus on health equity for underserved residents of the area. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to teach introductory and advanced courses at the undergraduate and graduate levels, partner on interdisciplinary grants, and to participate in or launch collaborative, community-based research. This position carries a 3/2 teaching load.

Minimum Qualifications:

- 1. A completed Ph.D. in English, Rhetoric, Medical/Health Humanities, or a closely related field by July 24, 2024.
- 2. A demonstrated commitment supporting and fostering diversity, equity, inclusivity, and accessibility.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Demonstrated teaching effectiveness
- Experience in interdisciplinary and/or community-based research
- Knowledge and/or experience related to sponsored research and grant writing.

- 1. A cover letter that provides statements of teaching and research.
- 2. A curriculum vitae.
- 3. A writing sample (up to 25-pages).
- 4. A 1-2 page statement that provides concrete examples of integration of diversity and accessibility into pedagogy and/or research. The committee hopes to learn from the diversity statement how the applicant supports and would work with diverse students, faculty and community members as an educator and researcher.
- 5. Contact information for 3 references. Once your application is submitted, the application site will request confidential recommendation letters from these references.

Applications should be submitted by November 27, 2023 for full consideration. The position will remain open until filled.
