Early in 2003, ATTW members were surveyed on a number of issues about the organization including about the bibliography. Members of ATTW refer to the bibliography because it “focuses on resources specific to technical communication.” Several members noted that they find the paper copy easier to use than online databases; others use the pdf version found on the ATTW website. Members also noted that it is a good reference for graduate students. Several members pointed out weaknesses in the bibliography that the committee continues to struggle with. One notes that an ATTW-NCTE best book was not in the bibliography. Another member questioned the organization of the bibliography and another suggested it did not cover his or her research area; others suggested it expand to cover fields outside of technical communication.

As editor, I was heartened by the favorable responses to the bibliography although the number who responded is less than a quarter of the ATTW membership. I expected to see fewer calls to continue the paper version of the bibliography and more comments about getting *TCQ* articles picked up in the online databases. The bibliography will change with the transition to a new publisher.

The publication of *Technical Communication Quarterly* through Erlbaum will change how the bibliography committee will collect and publish resources. Publishing the bibliography in the fall issue will require getting the bibliography ready in early spring when committee members are busy with teaching and other responsibilities. Also, frequently the last issue of journals does not reach members or libraries until early spring. As the committee reviews the publication process, they will also review the survey results and work to improve the coverage and accuracy.
